### Charity news

- Mrs Luebcke discussed that the school has raised over £800 for the charity Cancer Research this year. During the year, money was also raised for the following charities too:
- The School Council were told that this is the time of year we usually start to think of a new charity for the year ahead and we ask the school for their ideas and votes.
- Some School Councillors suggested that we could perhaps have one big charity and one small and more local charity for the coming year.
- One school Councillor asked if we could perhaps find out why the Year 6 Cookie project ended and whether this could happen again.
- As the NASS cake sale raised just over £200, pupils wondered whether we should perhaps consider
  having regular cake sales outside school. Perhaps every month a different year group of pupils could
  ask their parents to help bake cakes and biscuits for the cake sale?
- Mrs Luebcke asked pupils what their thoughts were on the type of events they would enjoy taking part in and which they think might be good fundraisers. Pupils suggested the following ideas:

- Mrs Luebcke finished the meeting by asking for the help of School Council members in asking their classmates to vote for the charity for the year ahead. Mrs Luebcke has prepared a list of charities linked to our four curriculum drivers. Pupils can use this to vote and they can either vote for a charity on the list or can add a charity to the list.
